Evy Bolton, a junior and member of the Edmonson County 4-H Teen Club is the State Wide 4-H Winner for the Dustin Worthington 1 ♥ Cows heifer scholarship! To date, over \$475,000.00 in animals have been awarded to Kentucky youth. The program is open to 4-H and/or FFA members in the state of Kentucky that don't have a heifer scholarship program already for their county. The goal is for youth to develop their heifer and to potentially start their own herd and someday become a profitable business that will aid start their own herd and someday become a profitable business that will ald in paying for education or starting his or her own herd. Current winners and past winners are encouraged but not required to give back to the program by donating the first-born heifer to continue the program for future years. Evy has already agreed to donate her first heifer back to the scholarship program to help another youth in the future.
